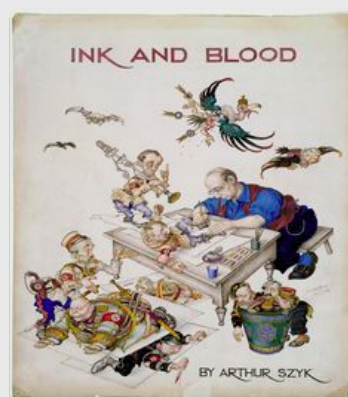

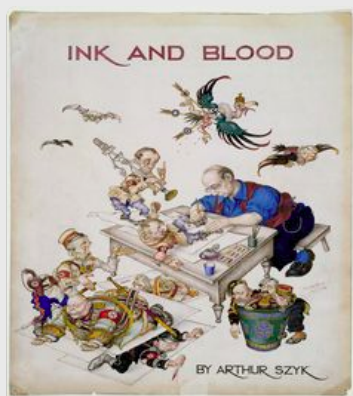

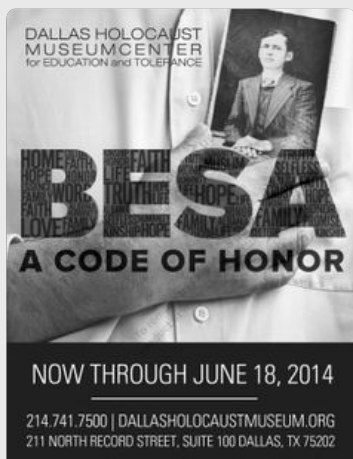
Drawn to Action: The Life and Work of Arthur Szyk, through January 31, 2015. Arthur Szyk (1894-1951) was one of America's leading political cartoonists during WWII, when he produced anti-Axis illustrations in newspapers and magazines to aid the Allied war effort. Although it has been more than 60 years since his instantly recognizable anti-Nazi caricatures and minutely detailed medieval-style illuminations graced the pages of national publications, his message is more important than ever.

Jan. 8-Feb 28, 2014 A History of the Kindertransport" displays items related to a British rescue operation that allowed 10,000 children, mostly Jews, to escape the Nazis in the months leading up to WWII. "The success of this initiative required the bravery of individuals, speedy policy creation and collaboration between diverse religious groups," say its hosts. "Above all, it required 10,000 children to say goodbye to their parents. ... Many never saw their parents again."
